The leader with the noted legacy, Mr. Abdullah Fahhad Al-Ajmi, concludes his professional career in the oil sector over 35 years, bidding farewell to a wonderful but not easy journey. The journey to the peak of the industry was hard and fraught with obstacles, but Al-Ajmi, by virtue of his intelligence, skill, and perception, surmounted them and accomplished noteworthy feats through extraordinary endeavours and sacrifices that propelled KIPIC to become an asset to the Kuwaiti oil sector and the national economy, while also forging new chapters in the history of the Kuwaiti oil industry.











His professional trajectory was markedbyagreatdealofdiligenceand concentration in all assigned duties, and his outstanding and remarkable performance propelled him to the pinnacle of his field, accumulating a wealth of expertise and experience in the implementation of diverse oil projects. This culminated in his leadership of numerous technical and engineering teams that specialised in the execution of oil projects. Job rotation between different positions within the same company, which was one of the keys to his professional success and afforded him the chance for advancement, success, and promotion, assisted him in developing a solid network of professional colleagues both inside and outside the organisation and in gaining an in-depth understanding of the company's operations.

Al-Ajmi has held various administrative and leadership roles during his career, eventually reaching the top of the organisation through his skills, determination, and commitment to giving back. Between 2008 and 2016, he managed the environmental fuel project at the Kuwait National Petroleum Company (KNPC), and he achieved a significant career milestone in March 2016 when he was promoted to the DCEO of Projects at the same company. In February 2021, he assumed the position of DCEO for Liquefied Gas and Petrochemicals at Kuwait Integrated Petroleum Industries Company (KIPIC), and later that year, he was promoted to the position of DCEO for Admin and Commercial.





Al-Ajmi spent his youth serving the oil sector, and when it came to project management, He worked with a great deal of seriousness and sincerity, which led him to adopt the most effective methods of executing work tasks, becoming familiar with oil refineries, and establishing connections with a large number of individuals. He is a remarkable individual who exudes a blend of a severe leader's planning and execution skills with the modesty and empathy of a humble leader, lowering his wings to contain and guide the people looking up to him.

Early on, his distinctive personal qualities garnered considerable attention. He is renowned for his astute intellect, formidable organisational skills, promptitude and strategic perspective, in addition to his exceptional concentration, which was exemplified by his meticulous task prioritisation.

As a leader, his name is linked with a great deal of compassion, listening enthusiastically to the perspectives of others, and paying close attention to the smallest of details. Throughout his career, he has always prioritised working with a long-term strategic vision in order to accomplish shared goals, as he was determined

to work with a great deal of optimism, his cheery smile, lightness and his focus on the human aspect never ceasing throughout the process.

No one can dispute that he is a rare distinguished and exceptional leader. His leadership qualities are mixed with his cheerful spirit, and he is characterised by a cheerful and endearing style. He was a decision-maker and was concerned about public money and the interests of the company, the sector, and the employees.

Both the Kuwait National Petroleum Company (KNPC) and the Kuwait Integrated Petroleum Industries Company (KIPIC) are able to proudly display the various accomplishments and milestones that he carried out throughout his time in the company. They have become symbols of the refining industry in the state of Kuwait, spanning from Al-Ahmadi to Al-Zour, travelling through Shuaiba and Mina Abdullah, including, but not limited to, the Environmental Fuel Project, the Fifth Gas Line.

He was the driving force for the full operation of the Permanent Liquid Natural Gas Import Facilities (LNGI), and the new main admin headquarters of the Kuwait Integrated Petroleum Industries Company (KIPIC) in Al-Ahmadi City. He

was known as the godfather of the project, where he was the main driving force and supporter of it from its commencement to its closing, that is, until it reached the point where it was finished, being consistently present throughout the whole of the project and observing all of its twists and turns. Al-Ajmi also followed Al-Ahmadi journey step by step. He was a continuous supervisor of the work, in addition to being present from time to time at the work site to supervise the final touches, while always striving to spread support and encouragement among the employees by holding periodic meetings to reach the desired goal, which is to complete the building in a record period of time. Through his role as a listening ear to those who were entrusted with this responsibility, he listened closely to a variety of perspectives. As a result of his high level of self-confidence and faith in the capabilities of others around him, he was able to accomplish the broadest range of what was achievable and what many people believed was impossible.

He launched the Business Excellence Program, Digital Transformation and other pioneering projects and initiatives. On top of that, he was present when the Al-Zour Refinery reached its maximum capacity for refining. It was during the phases of running Al-Zour Refinery that he made the formal announcements in the name of "KIPIC," sparing no effort in doing so until the refinery was completely functioning.

So, today Abu Fahhad's journey, the man of good reputation, friend, colleague, brother, and advisor, comes to an end, after all the support and good intentions he has shown over the years, and he is drawing the curtain on a stage of his life filled with work and sincerity in order to provide everything that stands out in his journey of "Making More Possible," to enter a new age after retirement, leaving an impeccable mark in his field of work.

On this particular occasion, a farewell party was organised for him on Sunday, March 10, at Al-Zour Complex, to honour his outstanding career. Those who were present at the party included a group of former and current leaders from the oil industry, a significant number of employees from Kuwait Integrated Petroleum Industries Company (KIPIC), and those who were responsible for the success of this event.

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At the outset of the celebrations, Mr. Waleed Khaled Al-Bader, CEO of Kuwait Integrated Petroleum Industries Company (KIPIC), delivered a speech in which he praised Al-Ajmi for the excellent work he had done during his extensive journey, as well as the leadership, persistence, and high determination that he displayed throughout his professional career, and the remarkable sacrifices that will remain in the memory of the oil sector, crediting him with achieving excellence in all of the major projects and responsibilities that were assigned to him.

Al-Bader discussed the highlights of Al-Ajmi's career, saying: When we look back, we see a career full of achievements that has become a source of inspiration for all of us. Together with a local recycling company in Kuwait (MRC), more than 30,000 caps were collected for recycling, which resulted in major advantages.






